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Operating Tip:

Always place the metronome on a stable, level surface to ensure a secure stand and smooth running.

Removing the protective cap:

To remove the protective cap, move the slider (A) down in the direction of the arrow. Then flip the protective cap forward to remove it.

Closing the protective cap:

To close the protective cap, place it with the underside in the opening of the housing. Then fold the protective cap towards the housing and lock it by moving the slider (A) upwards in the opposite direction to the arrow.

Winding the mechanical spring:

Turn the watch key clockwise to wind the mechanism spring. Stop the rotation as soon as the resistance noticeably increases. Never turn the watch key with force.

Metronome Start:

To start the metronome, carefully release the pendulum from its detent. To do this, push the upper end of the pendulum slightly backwards towards the metronome housing and then move the pendulum to the left or right side stop. Now release the pendulum to start the metronome.

Metronome Stop:

To stop the metronome, gently catch the pendulum and guide it back to the center position. Lock it in place by moving the top end of the pendulum back and sidewards under the holding lug.

Tempo Adjustment:

The tempo can be changed by sliding the shifting weight on the pendulum. Moving the weight up slows the metronome speed. Moving the weight downward increases the metronome speed. There is a scale on the pendulum. The upper edge of the shifting weight marks the selected speed in BPM (beats per minute).

Set time signature:

By moving the selector switch on the left side of the housing, a bell can be activated. This allows you to emphasize the first beat of a 2, 3, 4 or 6 beat bar.
